THE STORM...

The storm is a crisis of values and investment. Long-term educator retention is key to student achievement and school improvement.

Shockingly, according to the Economic Policy Institute, **Colorado ranks 51st in competitive teacher pay**, behind all 50 states and Washington, D.C.

EDUCATOR EXODUS

These problems are pushing our education crusaders out. The 2025 Colorado Education Association Survey Observations:

Statewide Teacher Shortages

- **52% Teacher and Licensed Staff Shortages** are more severe than in previous years
- 69% Shortage of Essential Support Staff including paraprofessionals, bus drivers, office support, and custodial workers

56% Lack of Substitute Teachers further straining classrooms and impacting student learning

The Great National Teacher Exodus

- 82% of Educators know someone who has left the profession in the past year
 - 7%of Educators are considering leaving
the profession soon

Today's teachers and education support staff are in the thick of the storm. They are under-supported, underpaid, and feel undervalued.


IMPACT \$67,500
