

A Decade of Commitment to STEM Education by Vail Health

This year's grant of \$15,000 provides teachers with the resources to develop inspiring and forward-thinking STEM projects and curricula. In the 2023-2024 school year part of the <u>Vail Health</u> funds supported Eagle County students' participation in the Colorado Science Olympiad, where 34 students qualified and competed. 
Vail Health proudly supports the Education Foundation of Eagle County's Classroom Grants program. Since 2012, EFEC has provided teachers and principals the opportunity to apply for funding to meet the needs of their classrooms for STEM, Equity, and Arts and Music. Because of Colorado's education funding, which, depending on the metric, ranks anywhere from 45th to 50th in the nation, available resources are chronically underfunded.

Vail Health is committed to K-12 STEM learning in Eagle County and has partnered with EFEC to fund STEM grants across Eagle County School District's 19 schools and 6,700 students. This year, Vail Health's \$15,000 gift will make possible innumerable opportunities across the district for hands-on learning in robotics, math, lab studies, and middle and high school participation in Science Olympiad across the valley.

For the first time, every student who attends Eagle County Schools middle and high schools and has an interest can apply to participate in the premier team STEM competition in the nation, Science Olympiad. At Battle Mountain High School and Berry Creek Middle School, the competition is fierce. Students try out to be on the SciOly team, and the standby team is deep. Students wanting to participate are placed into events based on their interests, science scores on placement tests, and their 5th-grade sciences CMAS scores. Marjorie Oyler, who leads the program and applied for EFEC's Classroom STEM Grant, shared, "Once the students are placed into events in teams of two, they start working with their teammates to research the event and what that particular competition entails. This year's events include Anatomy and Physiology, Bridge Building, Crime Busters, Experimental Design, Disease Detectives, Ornithology, and more. Students learn the scientific process. Students then transfer their learning into their science classrooms."

Vail Health's support of EFEC's Classroom Grant program effectively empowers Eagle County School's STEM teachers to educate with an innovative and engaging curriculum that ensures successful outcomes for every student, regardless of socioeconomic status.



In August 2023, the Eagle County School Board of Education voted to place two critical tax initiatives on the ballot: **5A**, a mill levy to invest in teachers, students, and curricula, and **5B**, focused on capital improvements.

The Education Foundation of Eagle County (EFEC) immediately pivoted its efforts to fundraising and managing the campaigns for both initiatives. Our team dedicated extensive resources and time to engage the community within the short timeframe leading up to the election. This intense outreach contributed to the successful passage of the capital improvements bond (5B), but unfortunately, the mill levy (5A), which would have supported vital STEM programming in schools, did not pass.
